John Bair holds over 20 years of diverse experience in the settlement management industry and the civil justice community. He is the Founder and CEO of Seventh Amendment Holdings, a company that provides comprehensive, plaintiff-focused settlement planning and management through its subsidiary companies, specifically Milestone Consulting and Monolith Advisors. He is the Co-Founder and President of the Bairs Foundation, a first of its kind 501(c)3 Public Charity providing emergency capital to litigants. Most recently, John has cofounded CrowFly, an online exchange that connects buyers and sellers of annuities.

A graduate of West Point, John served in the U.S. Cavalry for seven years as a Captain and Aviation Officer. He founded and was the CEO of Forge Consulting, a national plaintiff structure firm, from 2003-2012. With Milestone, John has advocated for bills designed to protect consumers and enable pro bono settlement consulting, provided services on over 10 major multidistrict litigations, and worked on landmark cases such as the BP/Deepwater Horizon settlement, the 9/11 Victim Compensation Fund, the 1983 Beirut Marine Barracks Bombing, the U.S. Embassy bombing in Tanzania, and notable national aviation disasters. He serves on the board of the Casey Feldman Foundation and the End Distracted Driving Campaign, as well as the Association for Justice's "Trial Lawyers Care" task force.

Injury Model Systems of care grant funded by the National Institute on Disability, Independent Living, and Rehabilitation Research. He is board certified in both Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation and Brain Injury Medicine.

Dr. Greenwald has been the recipient of multiple awards for his clinical work, research work, and teaching, and has published multiple articles and book chapters in the areas of brain injury rehabilitation. Currently, he is involved in several research studies to improve the care of brain injury survivors.
