Clients undergo MRI. One of the series within the MRI is called Diffusion Tensor Imaging (DTI).



DTI is very sensitive to the damage to microscopic brain tissue, which is the underlying injury in a concussion. Defense attorneys have tried nationally to keep it from being used during trial because it debunks arguments that the client is not hurt. Ken has experience utilizing DTI during trial. He will discuss DTI, what it is, what the findings may mean and how to use it during trial, as well as how to defend against attempts by defense attorneys to preclude it.

# 1:30pm – 2:30pm Autonomic Nervous System Injuries Following TBI Presented by Michael Ronemus Ronemus & Vilensky, LLP

TBI can impact multiple organs throughout the body, which at first glance, would not seem related to the injury. The autonomic nervous system which regulates the non-voluntary functions of our body can also sustain injury from a TBI – Dysautonomia - which can cause serious consequences. Physical problems can be varied and include such things as blood pressure irregularities and vestibular dysfunction, inability to visually focus, problems swallowing and digestive problems, fecal incontinence, urinary incontinence, inability to empty the bladder, spine pain, sexual dysfunction, menstrual irregularity and even symptoms consistent with complex regional pain syndrome (CRPS) including temperature irregularities and discoloration of the limbs are among those that are caused by a TBI. Michael will present on these impacts, Dysautonomia and the importance of working with a doctor who is familiar with Dysautonomia so that all the client's injuries resulting from TBI can be presented and related.

# David Ball, PhD. Malekpour & Ball Litigation Strategy

Born in NY's Appalachian Mountains, lived on farm/applejack distillery with my bootlegging grandaddy, daddy, and uncles until the revenuers chased us clean out of the mountains and all the way down to Stamford, CT the year after WWII ended. Ran a lemonade stand and

once mowed someone's lawn. Drove taxis in high school. In high school came in second for class clown behind Charlie Karp, damn him, played football for one day, marched off to master science and engineering at Rensselaer Polytechnic, avoided ROTC, and eventually decided to leave engineering so started IN physics until the Dean gently observed that there are no B-minus physicists, so I drifted off to Alfred University in western NY state where I managed to drop out of pre-med because bio labs stink, continued to avoid ROTC, went on the first anti-Viet Nam war march, fell headlong into English lit, got permanently caught by theater, during the folk scare mastered most of the strings of a guitar and had the world's second-best jug band, The Green Hornet and his Shazam Singers.
